(Båstad, Sweden) — The Aurora, Scandinavia's leading car and lifestyle event, returns to Norrviken Gardens in Båstad, Sweden, from June 27–29, 2025. Following its celebrated debut, the second edition will showcase an even more exceptional lineup of automobiles, including a selection of iconic BMW Art Cars, marking 50 years of this iconic collection.

Our Hypercar Partner, Koenigsegg, returns with another extraordinary lineup. At last year's event, The Aurora proudly hosted the world premiere of the groundbreaking Koenigsegg Chimera.

In addition, The Aurora 2025 will offer an expanded lifestyle experience, and an unforgettable weekend for the whole family.

Building on the resounding success of its 2024 debut, The Aurora has cemented its place as a premier event on the global automotive and lifestyle calendar – where Classic Icons and Hypercars converge.

Last year's event drew over 10,000 visitors from across the globe. This year, the team behind The Aurora is setting its sights even higher — aiming to welcome 15,000 guests. Helping drive that ambition is a world-class line-up of partners and a collection of extraordinary automobiles, many of which have never before been seen in Scandinavia.

This year, BMW will showcase four Art Cars in conjunction with BMW celebrating 50 Years of Art Cars. It will be a unique opportunity to view these priceless rolling art pieces. The Art Cars on display will be:

1975 BMW 3.0 CSL by Alexander Calder

The BMW 3.0 CSL by Alexander Calder marked the beginning of the BMW Art Car Collection in 1975—and stands as one of the artist's final works. Known for his vibrant mobiles and monumental sculptures, Calder brought his signature style to the race car with bold colors and sweeping forms. The car competed once, at Le Mans in 1975, before retiring due to a mechanical issue. It has since become an icon on display, blending art, engineering, and motorsport heritage.

3.2 liter six-cylinder inline engine, 480 horsepower. Top speed of 291 km/h.

1977 BMW 320i Turbo by Roy Lichtenstein

Roy Lichtenstein's BMW 320i Art Car, unveiled in 1977, brings his iconic pop art style to life with vivid "Benday Dots" and flowing lines meant to depict the car's journey—even before it begins. "I wanted the lines I painted to be a depiction of the road showing the car where to go," he said. After its debut at the Centre Pompidou in Paris, the car raced at Le Mans, finishing first in its class. Lichtenstein, a pioneer of American pop art, saw the car as a canvas for storytelling in motion.

2-liter four-cylinder inline engine, 300 horsepower. Top speed of 257 km/h.

1979 BMW M1 by Andy Warhol

Andy Warhol's 1979 BMW M1 Art Car is one of the most iconic in the collection. Painted by Warhol himself—directly onto the car with expressive brush and finger strokes—it captures the sensation of speed in motion. "When a car is going really fast all the lines and colors become a blur," he said. The 470 bhp M1 went on to race at Le Mans, finishing second in its class and becoming a fan favorite for its raw energy and bold visual impact.

3.5 liter six-cylinder inline engine, 470 horsepower. Top speed of 307 km/h.

2010 BMW M3 GT2 by Jeff Koons

Jeff Koons' BMW Art Car, unveiled in 2010 at the Centre Pompidou, brought his signature burst of energy and color to endurance racing. Just 10 days later, the car competed at the 24 Hours of Le Mans and quickly became a fan favorite, inspired by speed and power.

Koons, one of the most celebrated contemporary artists, designed the car to evoke motion—even at a standstill—blending art and performance in a striking tribute to motorsport.

4-liter V8 engine, 500 horsepower. Top speed of 300 km/h.

This year, BMW's theme, "One of One," celebrates the most unique and exclusive creations to leave Munich's factory gates. As part of this showcase, BMW will present a selection of vehicles demonstrating the full potential of the BMW Individual program, showcasing what they can do for their most enthusiastic customers. Amongst the cars that BMW will bring to The Aurora are:

2000 BMW X5 Le Mans (E53)

A high-performance concept that redefined what an SUV could be. Powered by a 6.1-liter V12 engine derived from the Le Mans-winning BMW V12 LMR race car, the X5 Le Mans produces over 700 horsepower and 720 Nm of torque. It accelerates from 0–100 km/h in just 4.7 seconds and boasts a top speed exceeding 311 km/h. First revealed at the 2000 Geneva International Motor Show, this singular vehicle held the SUV lap record at the Nürburgring for nearly two decades.

2000 BMW M3 Touring (E46)

A tantalizing glimpse at what could have been. Although fully engineered and production-ready, the E46 M3 Touring was never released to the public. Equipped with a 343-horsepower inline-six and 365 Nm of torque, the car remained hidden in BMW's secret garage until its surprise unveiling in 2016 — 16 years after its creation. This one-off prototype paved the way for the eventual launch of the first-ever production M3 Touring in 2020.

1992 BMW M8 Prototype (E31)

The original BMW M8 was a myth for years — a V12-powered monster that never officially existed. Developed in the early 1990s and only shown to the public decades later, the E31 M8 featured a 6.0-liter V12 producing 640 horsepower and 650 Nm of torque. With a top speed of over 300 km/h and muscular styling to match, it remains one of the most legendary prototypes in BMW's history.

1999 BMW Z3 V12 (E36/7)

A bold experiment that proved BMW's willingness to push boundaries — and engines. In 1999, engineers squeezed a 5.4-liter V12 from the 750i and 850i into the compact Z3 Roadster. The result: 326 horsepower, 490 Nm of torque, 0–100 km/h in 5.5 seconds, and a top speed of 263 km/h. It remains a single, unforgettable example of German engineering flair and humor.

In 2024, the Classic Car Best of Show was awarded to a 1955 Lancia Florida Coupe, while the Hypercar Best of Show went to a 2012 Bugatti Veyron Grand Sport 'Wei Long'. For 2025, the competition promises to be even more exceptional.

A panel of distinguished Concours judges—renowned for their design, restoration, and innovation expertise—will evaluate each entrant to the highest international standards. Every car will be judged individually, ensuring a fair and thorough assessment.
